Jon McGill Presents Critical Thinking Workshop

BCP Director of Academic Affairs Jon McGill presented a workshop entitled "The Power of Critical Thinking" at City Neighbors Foundation's Progressive Education Summit on January 24th and BCP's most recent Educator Think Tank on January 13th.

The workshop provided an overview of the current research on higher order questioning as a way to enhance and encourage critical thinking.

The session included hands on examples of how best to use narratives, games, and puzzles to increase student ability to ask and answer higher order questions.

"We had a really engaging time at yesterday afternoon's Think Tank. I found that my brain was highly activated by the puzzles and I got a lot of good ideas from the challenges and strategies we discussed," said BCP Academic Coach Sue Lattimore.

One element of the workshop asked participants to work with examples of Edward DeBono's "Lateral Thinking".

DeBono was a British psychologist and educator who, in the 1960's, developed programs and puzzles which were precursors of today's cliché of "thinking outside the box"

The session was interactive and generated lots of energy and a healthy application of laughter as the teachers worked through the materials and issues.

"On behalf of the 15 participants, I can say that our novice teachers felt really supported and professionally stimulated by the session. This is definitely the kind of high-quality professional development that we've aimed for in establishing the Educators Think Tank," said Ms. Lattimore.

Kids 4 K9s Teaches Compassion to City Springs Students

Last spring City Springs Elementary/Middle School added a new member to their team of dedicated professionals and she is one of the few team members who can interrupt almost any meeting to say hello to Principal Richetta.

Her name is Bella and she is a very friendly 80-lb. Golden Retriever/Standard Poodle mix who works for the Kids-4-K9s program.

In June 2012 Natalie Keegan established Kids 4 K9s with funding support from the Open Society Institute-Baltimore and began delivering humane education programming in the Baltimore City Public



Schools and surrounding communities.

The program's initial focus was to establish and grow an animal cruelty awareness

campaign, but, quickly grew into an animal assisted program that uses the natural bond between children and animals to teach empathy and encourage nonviolent ways to resolve conflict.

"The Kids-4-K9s Humane Education Program is a fun and interesting way to help students learn about animals, but also about humanity and compassion," says Keegan.

The program familiarizes students with the emotions of animals and their basic needs, bringing to light tough societal issues and gently guides students through the moral dilemmas raised to help students formulate their own code of ethics.

"The Kids-4-K9s curriculum is excellent, and Natalie Keegan is an effective instructor, but Bella is incredible!" said Principal Rhonda Richetta.

"Adding to the wonderment of Bella, the books and materials used in the classroom are thought-provoking and serve to develop the social skills and awareness Kids 4 K9s aims to teach.

"Bella has touched so many hearts of children (and adults) in our school, and because of her the lessons learned will have a lasting impact. We are fortunate to have Kids-4-K9s at City Springs!"
