The BCP Education Model

- **Direct Instruction**: a research-based curriculum that teaches all students to mastery
- **Core Knowledge**: coordinated Core Knowledge content from PreK - 8
- In-Class Coaching: expert coaches provide oneon-one teacher mentoring



- **Professional Development**: customized training for over 200 teachers
- **Recruitment**: recruiting and pre-screening potential teacher candidates





- **CHAMPS**: a positive classroom management curriculum
- Restorative Practices: a school culture and conflict resolution model
- **NWEA MAP**: an online assessment that measures student growth



- BCP Middle Grades Curriculum: a web-based Core Knowledge curriculum
