Darryl D. De Sousa, Baltimore City Police Commissioner, has served the Baltimore Police Department since 1988. He was appointed Deputy Police Commissioner in August 2015 after serving as the Chief of Patrol. He was appointed as a law enforcement fellow with the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) in August 2016 and Baltimore City Police Commissioner in February 2018.
